- A minimum of 39 hours of 3000-4000 level courses are required for graduation.

Musical Theatre Certificate within the B.A. Stage and Screen

The Musical Theatre Certificate offers students an in-depth experience in the world of musical theatre. This 21-hour interdisciplinary program is designed to empower students to explore and refine their talents across the core disciplines of musical theatre: acting, music, and dance. With guidance from experienced faculty and curriculum, students will emerge as well-rounded artists with the skills and confidence to meet the demands of the industry.

To be eligible for the certificate, students must:

- Be enrolled in the B.A. in Music or B.A. in Stage and Screen degree.
 The optional certification must be earned simultaneously with one of these degrees and will be awarded in conjunction with the degree via a notation on the transcript.
- Successfully complete an audition evaluated by faculty from both programs
