PARALEGAL STUDIES, AS

The purpose of the A.S. in Paralegal Studies is to provide students with the basic skills necessary to perform specifically delegated substantive legal work under the supervision of an attorney. This degree is designed mainly for students who have not attended college before or those who have a limited amount of previous college credit. All of the courses in the Paralegal Studies Certificate are included in the A.S degree. Therefore, we encourage A.S. students to add the Certificate as a secondary curriculum.

Please note that paralegals and other non-lawyers may not provide legal services directly to the public, except as permitted by law. Note also that all Legal Studies and Paralegal Studies students are required to take at least nine (9) semester credits or equivalent of legal specialty courses through face-to-face or online synchronous instruction. Transfer students must provide proof of such credits if taken elsewhere.
