The Sociology and Social Services program focuses on the study of our behavior as social beings and includes a basic core of courses essential for a wide variety of careers specific to and outside of sociology. In addition to providing students with a strong foundation in sociological thought, this curriculum prepares students with the innovation, critical thinking abilities, global understandings, and writing skills that employers in all fields consistently seek.

Graduates of this program will be able to:

- a. Apply the basic theories and concepts of sociology
- b. Apply the accepted practices of sociological research
- c. Examine the impact of race, ethnicity, class, gender, and sexual orientation within social institutions
- d. Apply the critical thinking skills needed to pursue post baccalaureate degrees or careers in sociology###related fields
- e. Connect their sociological training with larger ideas of social justice and foster a respect for community service and engagement
